Lewis Carroll, the pen name of Charles Lutwidge Dodgson, was an English writer, mathematician, and logician born on January 27, 1832.

He is best known for his beloved works

“Alice’s Adventures in Wonderland”

and its sequel, “Through the Looking-Glass,
and What Alice Found There.”

Published in 1871, “Through the Looking-Glass”

follows Alice as she steps through a mirror

into a reversed world where she encounters

characters like the Red Queen, Tweedledum

and Tweedledee, and the Jabberwock.

Structured like a game of chess, the novel continues

Carroll’s playful use of language and imaginative

storytelling, making it a timeless classic

in children’s literature.
